Faith Formation Coordinator

General: (for all Coordinators)

Coordinators will have a high degree of maturity and specific skills in their area of responsibility.

Coordinators will work under the supervision of the Camp Director.

Coordinators along with the Camp Director and Assistant Director will be responsible for setting the camp climate, working with other staff and campers and carrying out the Camp program in exciting and innovative ways.

Coordinators will provide weekly lesson plans, which are age appropriate, to the Camp Director at the start of each camping week.

Coordinators have an important role for campers to have a successful camping experience. They are closely involved in all Camp activities, participating, supervising, assisting campers and staff and serving as a positive role model.

General description of capacities and duties required for Coordinators:

- To live in a Christian community which encourages staff and campers to grow in their understanding of God, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.
- Willing to work as part of a team with other staff members.
- Serve as a positive role model to other staff and campers by participating in and leading activities.
- Has an ability and desire to work with children and youth.
- Takes responsibility for, planning, and carrying out daily camp activities as assigned.
- Is accountable to the Camp Director.
- Will attend and assist in staff training.
- Willing to work with the counselors-in-training.
- To be proactive in preventing bullying and ensuring camper safety. Responding immediately to any incidents among campers.
- To lead campers in the daily clean-up of camp ie. Cabins, other buildings, grounds....
- Sleep in an assigned cabin with campers.
- Complete assigned clean up duties at the end of each Camp.
- Ensure personal items, equipment and assigned area in a cabin or in the lodge is at all times kept in a clean, neat and orderly manner.
- Other duties as required.

Particular duties relating to each camping season:

• At the beginning of each season, the director, assistant director, and staffing committee will determine how specific duties may be assigned or divided among staff, based on training, interest, and need.

Purpose:

• The purpose of the *Faith Formation* Program is to give campers an opportunity to develop skills of living and working together as a Christian community with other campers as they participate in a bible study program

Specific Duties include:

- Work under the supervision of the Camp Director.
- Attend pre-camp training and events.
- Leads the daily Morning Watch and Vespers program.
- Plan and execute, in consultation with the Camp Director a Christian Development program which is consistent with the mission of Camp Abby and Christian Development curriculum/theme.
- Keep an inventory of supplies and let the Director know when more supplies are needed.
- Ensure that all equipment, the grounds, and/or rooms used during the Christian Development program are properly cleaned, returned to their proper place and stored daily.
- To complete incident reports as soon as possible.
- Make a complete inventory at the end of Camp and make recommendations regarding the purchasing of needed supplies.

Qualifications:

- Has a personal commitment to Christian Faith.
- Is respectful and open to be in conversation with campers who come from different faith traditions and or have questions about Christian faith.
- Has an ability to share biblical stories with children and youth in an engaging manner and explore their potential meaning.
- Has a basic understanding of (or a willingness to develop before Camp) the Creedal Statement of the United Church and the Faith Formation Guidelines for United Church Camps.
- Has an ability to lead others in daily spiritual disciplines such as Morning Watch, Evening Vespers, Small Group prayers.
- Has an ability to lead small group discussion based on the Christian Development Curriculum chosen by the Camp Board.
- Must have a completed First Aid certificate by June 1 (of current year)
- Be able to administer basic first aid,
- To work in relationship with vulnerable individuals who are under the age of consent,
- To have a level 2 Police check by June 1 (of current year)
- WHIMIS training (we will provide)
